Results for the nine months ended 30 June 2017 were lower than that of 2016, as the economy continues to contract. Net income before tax was \$10,619,314 compared to \$11,964,529, a decrease of 11.24%
Group sales of \$110,781,472 declined by 6.84% with a resultant decrease in gross margin of 7.38% to \$25,470,146. Other income increased slightly by 4.0%. Expenses decreased slightly by 0.71%.
Non-retail departments are expected to perform as 2016.
Management believes that unless new major projects come on stream, outlook for the remaining three months is for a similar decline in sales and profitability compared with 2016.
